**Liturgy of the Hours and Communion Service:** Monday and Friday at 7 A.M.

**Baptisms:** First and third Sundays at 2:00 P.M. and at Baptism Sundays scheduled throughout the year. **Baptism Preparation:** Second Tuesday of the month at 7:30 P.M. in the chapel. Parents are encouraged to attend this session early in the pregnancy. Baptisms are scheduled after participating in the session.

**Marriage:** Ideally, couples planning to marry at Saint Ann should contact the Parish Office a year in advance so that they may complete the necessary marriage preparation process.

**Penance/Reconciliation:** Saturday from 4:00 to 4:45 P.M. in the Daily Chapel or anytime by appointment.

**Anointing of the Sick/Communion to the Homebound:** Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs or when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for an extended period. Arrangements can be made to bring communion to those unable to get to church. In an emergency, call the Parish Office anytime. **Nighttime emergency phone number is 882-3173.**

**A Letter from Gary Maccaroni**

Dear Friends,

The Feast of *Corpus Christi* (**Body of Christ**), now celebrated in the Latin Church on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday, commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist—the Lord’s Supper. It was introduced so that Christians would not lose sight of the importance of this central belief and great mystery of our faith. *Corpus Christi* became a mandatory feast in the Roman Catholic Church in 1312.

In 2004, on the feast of *Corpus Christi*, now referred to as the **Body and Blood of Christ**, Pope John Paul II announced the “Year of the Eucharist,” asking Catholics the world over to take a fresh look at this central mystery of our faith.

As Catholic Christians, we gather on Sunday to remember what God has done for us, we come into God’s saving presence, and we look forward to the day when God will be “all in all.” The Church throughout the world celebrates the **Body and Blood of Christ**. Our celebration of this special feast is an opportunity not only to renew our appreciation of the Eucharist in our own lives, but also to remind ourselves of and be strengthened in our communion with the living mission of the Church, the mission to make Christ present in this world and to share the gift of salvation that Christ has extended to us and that we are to extend to others. Perhaps we can take some time throughout the week to reflect on one or more of the following profound realities that the Eucharist brings to us:

- The Eucharist is the “source and summit of Christian life,” sustaining the Church and its mission.
- The Eucharist makes us sharers in God’s own life.
- The Eucharist brings unity to the People of God.
- The Eucharist unites us with the heavenly liturgy as we anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all.
- The Eucharist is a living reality, and this is why we speak of Christ’s “Real Presence.”
- The Eucharist is a great gift, showing God’s graciousness toward us.
- The Eucharist moves us out into the world, furthering the mission of the Church, which is to draw the world into full and living union with Christ himself.

**Friday Is the Feast of the Sacred Heart**

The Feast of the Sacred Heart celebrates not an event but the love of God manifest in the heart of Jesus. Devotion to the Sacred Heart grew through the Middle Ages and reached its climax with the vision of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque. This feast appeared first on the Universal Church calendar in 1856; it occurs each year on the third Friday after Pentecost or the Friday following the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. **We will celebrate Taizé Prayer for the Feast of the Sacred Heart at 7:30 P.M.** in our church. This is a great way to place ourselves in the presence of God and experience the love of God in the sung prayer of the community.

**Saturday is the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary**

This feast entered the liturgy as a companion to the Sacred Heart. Only under Pope John Paul II was it raised from an optional to an obligatory memorial. Mass will be celebrated at 8:00 A.M. Saturday morning. This is the last feast of the liturgical year with a date commuted from Easter.

Saint Ann Novena to Focus on Eucharist  
Fr. Bob Schramm, director of our 2005 Saint Ann Novena, will focus his presentations on the Eucharist as we mark the "Year of the Eucharist." Fr. Bob promises to help all of us gain a better understanding of the Mass and how we can more actively participate in Sunday worship. Just last week Pope Benedict said to a crowd gathered at the Vatican, "Each parish is called to rediscover the beauty of Sunday, the day of the Lord, in which Christ's disciples renew, in the Eucharist, communion with the One who gives meaning to their joy and exhaustion of each day." The theme of the Italian Eucharistic congress, which the Holy Father visits this weekend, is "We Cannot Live without Sunday."

**Do You Know We Have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament Every Tuesday? Each Tuesday from 12:00 noon to 7:00 P.M.** the Eucharist is exposed on our main altar and the church is open for quiet prayer and reflection and refreshment. Stop in for an hour or for just a few minutes to refresh yourself and to rest quietly before our loving and forgiving God.

## **Gospel for May 29, 2005**

**The Body and Blood of Christ - Jn 6:51-58**

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."



The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."
