**Baptisms:** First and third Sundays at 2:00 P.M. and at Baptism Sundays scheduled throughout the year. **Baptism Preparation:** Second Tuesday of the month at 7:30 P.M. in the chapel. Parents are encouraged to attend this session early in the pregnancy. Baptisms are scheduled after participating in the session.

**Marriage:** Ideally, couples planning to marry at Saint Ann should contact the Parish Office a year in advance so that they may complete the necessary marriage preparation process.

**Penance/Reconciliation:** Saturday from 4:00 to 4:45 P.M. in the Daily Chapel or anytime by appointment.

**WATER:  
Called to Stewardship**

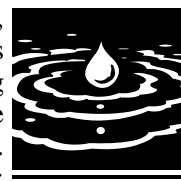

Water is both precious and finite. While water covers three fourths of the Earth's surface, 97.4% is salt water; 1.8% is frozen; only 0.8% is fresh water. Let's challenge the wasting and poisoning of our water supply. Over 1.5 billion people lack safe drinking water. Here's an invitation to conserve!

Turn the water off when not needed while washing hands, shaving, brushing teeth. Washing our hands with the tap constantly running takes two gallons but takes only one gallon with the tap turned off and on. Shaving with the tap on uses 20 gallons; with the tap off, only one. Brushing teeth, tap on, 10; tap off, one half!



How much water would I use each day if I had to pump or carry it by hand? Normal toilet flushing uses 5-7 gallons. Fill a small milk jug and put it in the tank. Better yet, install an efficient toilet that uses fewer than two gallons.

A small leak from a faucet can waste 50 gallons of water per day. Fix leaky faucets. When using public facilities, report drips to the proper authorities. Ask why automatic sprinklers are running in the rain. Why do we water the street? When appropriate, recommend a drip system instead of sprinklers for lawn and garden.

The average washing machine uses 40 gallons per load. Can you wash fewer loads each week? Review your rationale for washing. Is it based on global solidarity, health considerations, or advertising? "Sparkling clean" sells more soap but might do nothing for our health.

Take only the number of showers you really need. Try one fewer this week. Need a shower to wake up? Wash your face instead. Install low flow showerheads. A regular shower uses 25 gallons, a tub bath 36. But a wet-down, soap-up, rinse-off shower uses only about 4 gallons! Turn off the water while soaping.

It takes 1,000 gallons of water to produce one pound of aluminum. If your state does not have a deposit on beverage containers, petition your state representatives to require it. Reduce or cease the use of aluminum cans altogether. Both producing and recycling aluminum are financially and ecologically costly.

## Gospel for June 12, 2005

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time - Mt 9:36-10:8

*Jesus' heart was moved with pity...*

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."



Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him.

Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

1. *When have I experienced true compassion, as the giver or the receiver? What am I learning about how to express compassion?*
2. *How does the word, phrase, or image that struck you from this week's scriptures speak to your life, the life of your parish, your family, or our world these days?*
