Liturgy, Worship and Prayer Ministries

ADULT CHOIR

Regularly leads the assembly in sung prayer, singing from both traditional and contemporary choral repertoire to add beauty and solemnity to our prayer and worship.

Requirements: A member of the parish who enjoys singing.

Time Commitment: Choir members typically sing at our 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass and practice on Wednesday evenings, from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m.

CANTATE DOMINO (Suspended at this time)

Gives our talented cantors an opportunity to sing together as a small ensemble for Masses, and special occasions, providing special music to enhance our Sunday worship.

Requirements: Must be a member of the parish who enjoys singing.

Time Commitment: Occasional practice and being available at special times.

CANTORS/MUSICIANS — Lead the assembly in song at all liturgies and help motivate the assembly in prayer and musical praise to God.

Requirements: A member of the parish who is comfortable singing/playing in front of the congregation and has knowledge and experience singing or playing a musical instrument as a soloist.

Time Commitment: Occasional practice and one or two scheduled Masses per month.

12:00 MASS BAND (suspended at this time)

Serves the community by aiding the sung prayer at the 12:00 P.M. Sunday Mass. The band seeks to involve singers and a variety of instruments.

Requirements: Must sing or play an instrument.

RESURRECTION CHOIR

Is a group of volunteer parishioners that leads the sung prayer at each Mass of Christian Burial celebrated in our parish. They do this to assist those who have lost a relative or friend through death.

Requirements: The choir is open to anyone who would like to assist in this ministry and is generally available during the morning hours.

Time Commitment: Usually one hour a week.

YOUTH CHOIR

It's comprised of youth from the parish, and provides our youth in **grades 6th through college** the opportunity to offer their unique style to praise God. The Youth Choir sings at the 10:30 AM Mass on the First Sunday of the month, and 9 AM Mass on the Third Sunday of the month, from September thru May.

Requirements: Any youth of the parish in grades 5th through college and who enjoys singing.

Time Commitment: Rehearsals Friday evenings 5:00-6:30 PM and starting in October 5:00-7:00 PM. Any special events the choir is asked to sing for.

ALTAR SERVERS

Young parishioners who assist at our community's Sunday liturgies—leads the procession at Mass and serves at the altar.

Training: Approximately forty-five minutes.

Requirements: Must be a member of the parish, 6th grade and older.

Time Commitment: Typically two Masses per month.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS

Laypersons who distribute the Eucharist both at our regular Sunday Liturgy (Mass) and bringing the Body of Christ to homebound parishioners.

Training: Approximately one hour.

Requirements: Must be a member of the parish.

Time Commitment: Typically two Masses per month.

LINEN CARETAKERS (suspended at this time)

Wash and prepare the altar linens used for Mass, and the albs worn during the Liturgy.

Requirements: Must be a able to pick up and drop off linens at the church.

Time Commitment: Typically one hour per week.

LITURGICAL ATMOSPHERE (ART & ENVIRONMENT)

Works in conjunction with the Liturgy Committee by taking responsibility for seeing that the church atmosphere reflects the proper liturgical season, including special feasts (holydays) and holidays. The committee coordinates the decorating of the church as well as the care, selection and arrangement of church flowers.

Requirements: A willingness to learn and work with a team of people. A good ministry for decorators.

Time Commitment: Usually one hour a week decorating the church.

LITURGY COMMITTEE (Suspended at this time)

Assists the parish in planning and directing good worship throughout the liturgical seasons of the Church. The committee reviews the upcoming liturgical season, evaluates the one just past, and communicates up-to-date liturgical information to the parish.

Requirements: Must be a member of the parish who can work with others and is willing to learn.

Time Commitment: Typically one 90 minute meeting per month.

Liturgy, Worship and Prayer Ministries

READERS

Proclaim the Word of God (assigned Scripture Readings) during the Liturgy.

Training: Approximately 30 to 45 minutes.

Requirements: Must be a confirmed member of the parish.

Time Commitment: Typically one to two Mass every month.

SACRISTANS (Daily Mass)

Are responsible for seeing that all is in place for the proper celebration of the sacraments. Responsibilities include setting up for Mass, taking proper care of candles, vessels, and books, and keeping the sacristy neat and orderly.

Training: Approximately 30 minutes.

Time Commitment: One hour per week.

USHERS

Endeavor to make all feel welcome during liturgical celebrations. Ushers (open to both men and women) greet, seat, distribute bulletins, see to the needs of the gathered community and accept our weekly contributions.

Requirements: Must be a member of the parish.

Time Commitment: Typically one to two Masses per month.

CENTERING PRAYER GROUPS (suspended at this time)

Practices the art of centering prayer, an ancient Christian prayer in which we are prepared, by sitting silently, to receive the gift of contemplation. It is a prayer of consent and surrender, that moves beyond conversation with God to communion

Requirements: None

Time Commitment: Typically one hour per week.

DIVINE MERCY PRAYER HOUR

On Tuesday afternoons, from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., includes recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet within the context of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Time Commitment: Usually one hour a week.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Takes place every Tuesday from 12:00 P.M. to 6:00 P.M. This rich form of prayer is supported by individuals who sign up to be present in the chapel in one-hour increments. A coordinator sets up for adoration, coordinates sign-ups of individuals, advertises to the parish, and generally ensures all goes well.

Time Commitment: Typically one hour per week.

OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE TRAVELING TORCH

This annual activity of receiving the traveling torch, in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe, takes place sometime between October and December.

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA (Suspended)

(Marian Devotion) is prayed Mondays at 1:30 p.m. in the chapel. Occasionally, Benediction (adoration and praise of the Blessed Sacrament) accompanies this devotional prayer.

Training: None

Time Commitment: One hour on Monday afternoons.

NOCTURNAL ADORATION

Takes place every First Friday at the Saint Michael campus, 8:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m..

NOVENA COMMITTEE

Comes together in June to help plan and execute the Annual Parish Novena to Saint Ann, nine days of prayer, July 18-26, including a festive celebration on the Feast of Saints Ann and Joachim.

SAINT JUDE/SAINT ANN NOVENA

TAIZE PRAYER

Is every Friday during Lent in Chapel. This form of prayer is a simple form of worship centered on the Cross, in the context of readings from sacred Scripture and periods of silence. It was inspired by the monastic tradition in Taizé, France.

Requirements for Leaders: A willingness to work with a team of people. The ability to sing and/or play an instrument.

Time Commitment: Usually one hour a week for the six weeks of Lent.

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

Members help develop and support ways the parish is awakening, and nurturing the faith of adults in the parish around the three major goals of (1) inviting and enabling ongoing conversion to Jesus, (2) promoting active participation in the life of the community and (3) preparing adults to act as disciples in the world.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Provides an atmosphere of prayer, support, and faith formation on the journey toward the Sacraments of Initiation for those seeking membership in or full communion with the Catholic Church.

Requirements: A willing heart and a commitment to the process.

BAPTISM PREPARATION

Led by parishioners, baptism preparation sessions are held monthly in order to help new parents prepare for the gift and responsibility of raising children in our Roman Catholic Faith. These sessions are usually held on the second Tuesday of the month from 7:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and are required before Baptism.

Training: Approximately one hour.

Time Commitment: Typically one 90 minute session every other month.

ADULT CONFIRMATION

Not to be confused with the R.C.I.A, adult confirmation is designed for baptized Catholics who have some knowledge of the Faith and who are active participants at Sunday mass. Adult confirmation is usually celebrated on Pentecost Sunday at the 11:00 a.m. Mass.

Requirements: Must be already confirmed and have a desire to connect to the parish.

Time Commitment: Program varies each year.

CATECHISTS (RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND GENERATIONS OF FAITH PROGRAMS)

A catechist is someone who presents the story of our Catholic Faith to young people in a way that enables them to see and experience faith as a "living reality."

Training: Catechist orientation session, usually in September.

Requirements: Completed the Sacraments of Initiation. A willingness to learn and desire to pass on faith to young people.

Time Commitment: Usually one hour and 15 minutes a week, September through May (Traditional Model) or two hours a month, September through May (Family Model).

ADULT BIBLE STUDY

GENERATIONS OF FAITH (GOF)

An alternative to traditional classroom-based religious education, is our family-centered model that moves to the rhythm of parish life. It encourages and empowers families to learn and grow in faith by observing, questioning, and praying together. It provides resources and support so participants can grow and deepen their Baptismal call to faith and service.
